Mountainland Continuum of Care Goals not assigned to a committee:

- Seek increased funding for supportive services statewide from the Utah State Legislature through the Pamela Atkinson Homeless Trust Fund.
- Implement a collaborative effort with local providers to educate county commissioners and local legislatures of the need for increased funding for supportive services

- Increase funds for supportive services from the Utah Pamela Atkinson Homeless Trust Fund with a portion of the funds coming from local County, foundations. Pursue collaborative grant for support services through HHS. Partner with other 2 Continua.
- Seek additional legislative appropriations for the Pamela Atkinson Homeless Trust fund (PAHTF).
- Support the development of the SSI unit within Central Region Department of Workforce Services to streamline clients' access to mainstream services. Encourage utilization and duplication to other DWS offices.
- Partner with other two Continua in Utah to increase funds an additional \$500,000 for supportive services from the Utah Pamela Atkinson Homeless Trust Fund and pursue a grant through HHS.
- Work with Salt Lake Continuum to develop a short range (one year) and long range (3 year) plan to prevent people living in mobile home parks from becoming homeless.
- Work with public officials to duplicate the existing Wasatch County Housing Trust Fund I (in the Mountainland CoC) in cities in Utah County and in Summit County. Utilize Housing Trust Funds to build variety of affordable housing projects and to promote home ownership.
- Seek state funding for two case manager housing specialists to work with clients to retain public housing.
- Provide feedback through conference calls to the Salt Lake focus group of providers to assess why employment percentages for the chronically homeless are so low and set goals on how to increase employment.
- Work with Salt Lake Continuum to develop a short range (one year) and long range (3 year) plan to prevent people living in mobile home parks from becoming homeless.
- Set up computer client computer stations as provider sites for use in seeking employment.
- Conduct a Point in Time Count each year.
- Collaborate with other Continua to pursue "One Stop Shop" with Dept. of Workforce Services.
- Pursue development of specialized job training and placement for homeless individuals with the Dept. of Workforce Services.

Individual Agency Specific Goals (not related to any specific committee):

- Create an "affirmative" business – a non-profit business venture that provides temporary employment and on-the-job training for homeless adults who lack the skills and experience necessary to obtain suitable employment elsewhere. Train and employ all adult clients who have the aptitude and interest in becoming employed at this business. Refer non-interested clients to DWS.
- Seeking appropriate funding outside the HUD Continuum of Care grant for new supportive services only grants.
- Partner with the Dept. of Workforce Services to send outreach workers to housing and homeless provider sites to assist clients.
- Increase capacity of the supported employment program at Friends of the Coalition (especially serving chronically homeless individuals).
- Train and implement strategies for helping clients to maintain the legal requirements of a lease.
