<p>Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Housing Program</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Action plan was presented to the Provo City Council and it was approved and they will have sufficient time to make any changes that are needed before May 18th • Centralized Intake process has been meeting regularly to discuss all of the different things involving an assessment tool • AdHoc Committee in Utah County has met and has updated Salt Lake on what is occurring, agree in standardization across the state which will make things consistent • 211 will do the initial intake procedure which will be virtual we have until September to begin. • Meeting June 9th from 3-5 at Lloyd Pendleton's office • State has gone 70 % for rapid rehousing and 30% homeless prevention, the reason is there is no real way to document and show how the homeless prevention is working and helping people • The definitions were set by HUD for both rapid rehousing and homeless prevention • Any letters that can be sent by agencies, and letter from the Continuum of Care to endorsement PO Box 1893 Provo, UT 84601 • Kena's organization is try to end substandard housing, and when people double up then they are putting both families at risk for relocation • Recommendation made by Myla to have the five million dollars that heavily funds rapid rehousing, for our community and rural communities it is backward, more money should be going to homeless prevention.
